

JUROR BIOGRAPHY

Emily Zaiden, Director and Curator Craft in America Center, Los Angeles, CA

Emily Zaiden is Director and curator of the Craft in America Center in Los Angeles, where she has curated more than forty exhibitions focused on contemporary craft and design for the Center and outside venues. Zaiden has published various exhibition catalogues and contributed articles and reviews to publications including; Archives of American Art Journal, Metalsmith, and Antiques and Fine Art. She has lectured on contemporary craft and American and international decorative arts topics at museums and venues across the country including the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, Craft and Folk Art Museum, Milwaukee Art Museum and Fuller Museum.

After completing an M.A. at the Winterthur Program in American Material Culture and a B.A. from UC Berkeley in American Studies and Italian, Zaiden served as Research Associate to the Decorative Arts department at the Los Angeles County Museum of Art. These selected works are a small but exemplary sampling of the vitality, ingenuity, and expertise that exists among craftspeople in Hawai'i today. The invited artists, who live on six of the islands, were chosen to showcase the melting pot of methods, materials, and perspectives that characterizes craft in Hawai'i. As a state with a deep vernacular heritage, the richness of indigenous and historic cultural traditions is a foundation for artists who strive to maintain or reawaken ties to the past. The incomparable beauty and complexity of the natural geography of this community of islands is echoed in the physical and metaphorical qualities of their work. The objects that they create, ranging in scale and media, reflect a spirit of exploration, innovation, and individual expression that is timeless yet contemporary and distinctly from Hawai'i.
