Three Dimensional Surface Patterns: Heat Transfer and Metallic Embellishment on Synthetic Fabrics

This workshop introduces the principal of 'sublimation' and 'thermal transfer' processes using disperse dyes and anodized aluminum tapes on synthetic fabrics. These methods exploit the thermal plastic nature of polymer while combining the basic principals of 'shibori' sewing and felting. Students will develop three-dimensionality in fabric design. Metallic surface embellishment is explored constructively, using anodized aluminum tape, and deconstructively, stripping aluminum coating from iridescent metallic organza. "Cloque", "devore" of metallic surface, "lacque" and felting layered materials are explored with polymer medium on paper and transferring images by ironing or heat pressing on fabric. Sewing machine and iron are required.



Juror and Workshop Instructor

Junco Sato Pollack is an assistant professor of textiles in the School of Art and Design at Georgia State University in Atlanta. Prior to this time she taught at Kutztown University, PA, Nazareth College of Rochester, NY and Parsons School of Design, NY. She received her MFA in textile design at the Rochester Institute of Technology and BA in linguistics and literature at Aoyama Gakuin University in Tokyo. Ms. Pollack has also studied in Paris, Tokyo and apprenticed with master weaver Tsuguo Odani.

Ms. Pollack is the recipient of numerous grants and awards, and her work has been featured in publications ranging from the Atlanta Journal and Constitution to the Japan Times; she was the featured artist in the Surface Designers Art and has published articles on various aspects of textile production and embellishment. She provided the translation for manuscripts and glossaries for Kimono Masterpieces from the Nomura Collection. Ms. Pollack's work has been shown and collected all over the world. She also is an active lecturer and luror.

igibility and Fees

All Artists-Craftspeople residing in the State of Hawai'i are invited to submit up to three entries per person. Functional and non-functional objects in or about fiber or fiber techniques; any medium will be accepted for jurying. Hawai'i Craftsmen members will be charged a non-refundable fee of \$10 per entry or \$20 for up to 3 entries. Non-members will be charged a non-refundable fee of \$30 per entry or \$50 for up to 3 entries. Participants may join Hawai'i Craftsmen at entry time to take advantage of the member's entry fee. Hawai'i Craftsmen is supported in a large part by membership dues. Membership dues are: seniors and student \$15, individual \$30, family \$40.

onditions and Display Regulations

Artists are encouraged to enter in traditional or non-traditional fiber medium with a fresh approach to using fiber materials or techniques. Entries in media other than fiber (clay, glass, metal, wood, etc.) will be judged from the perspective of the fiber theme. For example a clay colled basket or a woven metal sculpture would be eligible for jurying. The exhibition is open, but not limited to any functional or non-functional craft objects in the categories of clay, fiber, metal, wood, glass and mixed media.

All entries must be of original design and created independently within the last two years. No work previously juried and exhibited on Oahu is eligible.

All works will be installed by the installation committee. Those entries that pose an installation problem may not be accepted.

It is understood and agreed that all entries are submitted at the owner's risk. Care will be taken in the handling of all entries, but neither Hawai'l Craftsmen nor the Honolulu Academy of Arts will assume responsibility for the loss or damage to works submitted, no matter how such damage might be sustained.

For those who are members of Hawai'l Craftsmen, a 20% commission will be taken on sales. A commission of 30% will be taken on sales of non-members' works. Accepted works, even when sold, must remain at the Academy Art Center for the length of the show and are subject to photographic reproduction for educational or publicity purposes.

Artists will be asked to sit the show one shift for each plece accepted, find a substitute or pay \$25 per shift.

Neighbor Islands: Send entries to Hawai'l Craftsmen, P.O. Box 22145, Honolulu, HI 96823 to arrive in Honolulu no later than Thursday, April 29, 1999. All entries must be packed in a sturdy reusable container. All packing materials must be reusable as well. All works will be returned in original containers. Artist will pay for shipping of work to Honolulu, Hawai'l Craftsmen will defray the costs of return shipping.

Return of Entries



Works accepted for exhibition must be picked up on Saturday, May 15, 1999 from 4:30-8:00 pm.
